EU Taxonomy Report: Unsung Cornerstone of Checklist for Smarter Appliance Shopping ESG Disclosure

"The mixed results of our second assessment of company reporting on the EU Taxonomy, which classifies what activities companies can claim as sustainable, reveal its foundational role in the ESG disclosure ecosystem is still widely underestimated. Our research found inconsistencies in eligibility reporting, low alignment levels, and flawed execution of mandatory requirements, suggesting companies need to step up their efforts. Not doing so comes with severe risks for satisfying other EU disclosure requirements.

Bottled Water Has up to 100 Times More Plastic Particles Than Previously Thought

"A paper published Monday [8th January] used a novel technique to analyse one-litre samples of bottled water for plastic granules, going down to just 50 to 100 nanometers in length - roughly the width of a virus. They found nearly a quarter of a million of these tiny particles per litre, about 10 to 100 times more than previously published estimates.

"By making clever appliance purchases, you can lower your cost of living while reducing your household emissions (and new appliances look pretty good too) - it's a win-win-win!

"Have you been waiting for the perfect opportunity to splash out on that new front loader washing machine or fridge freezer? Flash sales can be a great opportunity to purchase a model which isn't usually in your price bracket, which can often be more energy efficient. But before you walk into the shop, be prepared and do your research first to find the best model for you.

"The pressure to decide quickly in store can tempt us to make on the spot purchases without considering the costs beyond the price tag - like how much energy your new appliance will chew through when you start using it, and how much money it can cost you to run (or save you) depending on what you choose.

"In the year leading up to March 2023, New Zealanders purchased 4.3 million new energy-regulated products - that's one every seven and a half seconds!

Corporate Climate Commitments Undermined by Lobbying Practices

"More than half of the world's biggest corporates are at risk of greenwashing their net-zero claims due to the industry associations they are part of and their political lobbying and influencing practices.

"A new study from InfluenceMap has found more than half of corporates have introduced ambitious climate targets, but these do not align with the organisation's current policy lobbying and influencing activities.

"The data, based on analysis of 293 companies from the Forbes 2000 list, categorises brands into performance brackets based on individual policy engagement and industry associations. It found 21.5% of companies are at 'significant risk' and 36.5% are at 'moderate risk' of greenwashing.

"In total, 58% of the world's largest corporations have put forward climate commitments which are being undermined by their approaches to policy influencing.

"The report warns of a 'major rift', between public-facing pledges and obscured lobbying and influence activities, with InfluenceMap warning corporates could be greenwashing as a result.

"Governments are failing to progress climate policy at the speed needed, and corporate influence is a key reason why', InfluenceMap's director and study author Will Aitchison said:

"Unless companies match their climate commitments with ambitious support for government-led policy action, the Paris Agreement goals will be impossible to reach.'

"Not only are many companies choosing to undermine their own climate commitments by lobbying against climate action, their net zero commitments are simply not credible. We need businesses to create a climate ambition loop where private sector leadership encourages and reinforces ambitious government action.'

Cheap Climate Grace

"Listen to anyone committed to addressing climate change today and what you'll hear is talk of 'carbon markets' and 'green capitalism'. According to this thinking, the climate problem can be solved primarily by nudging public and private investment towards climate friendly technologies. Climate change in other words, stems from market imperfections which can be solved through reengineered investment structures. No disruption to the fundamentals of our economic models is necessary; no sacrifices required. The orthodoxy of neoliberalism remains secure if only mildly altered.

"Dietrich Bonhoeffer wrote of the hazards of doing things on the cheap, of trying to get something for nothing. While he wrote theologically, his concept of 'cheap grace', the act of seeking salvation without contrition, forgiveness without repentance, is instructive to this attempt to solve a complex problem through easy means.

"In the Bonhoeffer vernacular, today's obsession with green markets amounts to Cheap Climate Grace, seeking climate salvation, without questioning our socio-economic behaviour, or committing to structural change, i.e., 'costly grace'. We can happily have our infinitely growing cake and eat it too; only now it'll be greener.....

As Plastic Production Grows, Treaty **Negotiations to Reduce Plastic Waste are** Stuck in Low Gear

"Plastic pollution has spread to Earth's farthest reaches, with widespread effects on wildlife, the environment and human health. To curb this problem, U.N. member countries are negotiating a global treaty to reduce plastic pollution, which they aim to complete by the end of 2024.

"That effort is well underway. In September 2023, the U.N. Environment Programme released the so-called zero draft – a first iteration of ideas and goals which emerged from the first two rounds of negotiations. And in November 2023, the Intergovernmental Negotiating Committee on Plastic Pollution met in Nairobi, Kenya, for the third negotiating round of a planned five sessions.

"Studies show plastic causes harm in all stages of its life cycle, from production through use and disposal. Because the draft treaty includes provisions which address all of these phases, environmental advocates greeted it as a step in the right direction.

"The draft includes 13 provisions which address issues such as reducing plastics production, the use of recycled materials, phasing out single-use plastics, promoting alternative materials and limiting the use of chemicals of concern materials which have high toxicities and the potential to be released from plastic products. But with three rounds of negotiations now complete, major questions remain unresolved.

Fighting Big Ag Pollution with Maps and Math

"Stacy Woods discusses how, from the factory to the field, the fertiliser industry delivers a multipronged hit to the environment, releasing dangerous heat-trapping gases at every step.

"Agriculture is a leading cause of water pollution in the United States thanks in large part to fertilisers, pesticides, and other pollutants from agricultural fields and factories. But Big Ag pollutes more than water. From toxic air pollution to climate-changing emissions, large corporate agribusinesses threaten public health and the environment. And that pollution has compounding consequences. As agricultural emissions alter the climate, for example, the resulting warmer winters and waters exacerbate the risk agricultural chemicals pose to the nation's waterways.

Emissions from Israel's War in Gaza Have 'Immense' Effect on Climate Catastrophe

"The planet-warming emissions generated during the first two months of the war in Gaza were greater than the annual carbon footprint of more than 20 of the world's most climatevulnerable nations, new research reveals.

"The vast majority (over 99%) of the 281,000 metric tonnes of carbon dioxide (CO2 equivalent) estimated to have been generated in the first 60 days following the 7th October Hamas attack can be attributed to Israel's aerial bombardment and ground invasion of Gaza, according to a first-of-its-kind analysis by researchers in the UK and US.

"According to the study, which is based on only a handful of carbon-intensive activities and is therefore probably a significant underestimate, the climate cost of the first 60 days of Israel's military response was equivalent to burning at least 150,000 tonnes of coal.

"This study is only a snapshot of the larger military boot print of war ... a partial picture of the massive carbon emissions and wider toxic pollutants which will remain long after the fighting is over', said Benjamin Neimark, a senior lecturer at Queen Mary, University of London (QMUL), and co-author of the research published on Tuesday on Social Science Research Network. Hearings in The Hague in Case Claiming Israel's Gaza War is Genocide

"A legal hearing into the war in Gaza opened in The Hague on Thursday [11th January] as the International Court of Justice (ICJ) hears arguments alleging Israel is committing genocide in the territory.

"South Africa, which has brought the case, is asking the UN court to act urgently 'to protect against further, severe and irreparable harm to the rights of the Palestinian people under the genocide convention, which continues to be violated with impunity'.

"It comes as the assault on Gaza – launched in response to the 7th October attacks on Israel by Hamas in which militants [brutally] killed 1,200 people, mainly civilians, and took 240 people hostage – continues to wreak a devastating toll.

"In its written application to the ICJ to open proceedings, South Africa said: 'The acts and omissions by Israel complained of by South Africa are genocidal in character because they are intended to bring about the destruction of a substantial part of the Palestinian national, racial and ethnical group.'

77 Groups Worldwide Back Genocide Lawsuit Against Biden in U.S. Court

"Dozens of legal and civil society organisations from around the world have thrown their weight behind a U.S. lawsuit accusing President Joe Biden, Secretary of State Antony Blinken, and Secretary of Defense Lloyd Austin for failing to 'prevent an unfolding genocide' in Gaza.

"In late December, 77 groups – representing tens of thousands of lawyers, civil society leaders, and activists from six continents – filed an *amicus* brief in a lawsuit which Palestinian human rights organisations, residents of Gaza, and U.S. citizens with family members impacted by Israel's ongoing assault brought against the Biden administration.

"In the *amicus* brief, which is an avenue for groups not directly involved in a lawsuit to give the court information to consider in its ruling, the organisations argue the plaintiffs establish a genocide, or serious risk of genocide, of Palestinians in Gaza is occurring. They also argue the U.S. is violating its duties under international law to prevent and not be complicit in genocide, and those U.S. failures contribute to the erosion of 'long and widely-held norms of international law', including the Genocide Convention and Universal Declaration of Human Rights, both established in 1948 in the wake of World War II.....

"The Biden administration has until Friday [12th January] to issue a response. The Oakland, California-based federal court is set to hear arguments on the plaintiffs' motion for a preliminary injunction, and on the Biden administration's motion to dismiss, on 26th January.
